

Year of Best Practices

The Curriculum and Assessment Committee, a group consisting of administrators and faculty members, has launched the "Year of Best Practices." Throughout the year, teachers will be involved in half-day inservices designed to improve teaching, and thus student performance.

The program was launched in September with a workshop for teachers which focused on Open Response prompts. The Open Response prompt is one component of the MCAS tests. English teachers, Gina Despres and Toni Weeden, presented how to create a question, how the MCAS Open Response prompt is scored, and how teachers can aid students in writing Open Response answers. Students now practice answering Open Response prompts each cycle in all their academic classes and related classes.

A second in-service program in October focused on Assessment. Deborah Herrmann (English teacher) and Heather Darcy (history teacher) demonstrated the advantages and disadvantages of using various assessment (testing) tools. In addition, the faculty was instructed in how to write valid and useful tests.

Under the direction of Jackie Machamer, a Technology in-service was organized for November. Each faculty member chose two topics related to using technology in the classroom. One more Technology in-service is planned for later this year.

The December program on Discipline was presented by an Old Colony adjustment counselor, Sharon LaCroix.

Other topics planned for this year include: Motivation, Time Management, and Students with Special Needs.

Get Involved with SkillsUSA

SkillsUSA serves more than 240,000 high school students, college students, and professional members associated with technical training programs.

SkillsUSA provides quality educational experiences for student in leadership, teamwork, citizenship, and character development. It builds and reinforces self-confidence, work attitudes, and communication skills. SkillsUSA emphasizes total quality of work, high ethical standards, superior work skills, life-long education, and pride in the dignity of work. In addition, the organization promotes understanding of the free enterprise system and involvement in community service activities.

Students have the opportunity to compete in two categories: shop and leadership events. Students who compete in their trades take written and practical tests to demonstrate their skills. They begin with competitions at school. Those winners participate at the district level. Gold and silver winners advance to the state competition. Students winning gold medals at the state level earn the right to compete nationally. Some trades even have international competitions

The leadership competitions are held school-wide. Students who win the school competition go directly to compete at the state level. Those who win gold medals advance to the national competition. Completions in this category include: Impromptu Speaking, Job Skill Demonstration, Knowledge Bowl, Bulletin Board, Open and Closing Meeting, Prepared Speech, and Chapter Business (a mock business meeting).

Students are recognized and rewarded by receiving scholarships, tools of the specific trade, and other awards. All students who are members of SkillsUSA can receive scholarships from various technical institutes and colleges.
