Congratulations to all of our fall sports teams as they represented Old Colony with great sportsmanship, commitment, and pride. The following teams were awarded the Mayflower Athletic Conference Championships: Football, Boys Soccer, and Volleyball. OC Carpentry's junior class attended the 2nd annual NARI (National Association of the Remodeling Industry) Remodeling Expo at the Bolton Fairgrounds. Students participated in hands-on demonstrations, mock interviews, and networked with potential employers. Students then had the opportunity to meet Kevin O'Conner from This Old House! This Old House was on location filming for their current season, #TOHGenNext . TOH teamed up with Mike Rowe (from Dirty Job's) to highlight the growing #SkillsGap in the construction field. What a great educational experience!

We are in the beginning of our 8<sup>th</sup> grade Career Awareness Days (see dates below), and any 8<sup>th</sup> grade student can now begin their application for admission to OC for the 2018-19 school year online! Visit <a href="www.oldcolony.us">www.oldcolony.us</a>, click on the "Apply Now" link, and complete the online registration application with your child. When the registration is complete, you will be contacted by email for the next steps. We will keep you updated on your application status!

The state accountability results are based on statewide test scores over time, student growth percentiles, annual dropout rates, graduation rates, and participation rates to classify schools into Levels 1-5. I report that **Old Colony RVTHS** has achieved a Level 2 rating, which means we are slightly deficient in meeting gap narrowing goals, overall. This year, the percent of students scoring **Proficient** 

or higher on the 10<sup>th</sup> grade MCAS was 96% in English Language Arts. The percent of students scoring Proficient or higher on the 10<sup>th</sup> grade MCAS was 83% in Mathematics, and 84% of students scored Proficient or higher on the 9<sup>th</sup> grade MCAS for Science Technology/Engineering.

Old Colony is happy to announce that, through working with the Commonwealth Dual Enrollment Partnership (CDEP), Mass Maritime Academy will, once again, be offering a dual enrollment opportunity for our students this spring semester.

The Guidance Office is once again promoting a Mass Maritime Academy (MMA) dual enrollment opportunity for our OC students to take FREE college-level courses and earn credit toward high school completion and their future college degrees. All courses will be held on Mondays, from 4-7 p.m., March 12- June 18, 2018. This opportunity is available to current sophomores, juniors, and seniors. Transportation to MMA will be provided by a chartered school bus that will also stop at GNBRVTHS. Although the courses and transportation are free of charge, students are responsible for the cost of the textbook which varies by class. SPACE IS LIMITED and on a first-come, first-serve basis. For additional information or for an application, students should see Mrs. Abaray in the Guidance Office.

UMass Dartmouth is also offering our students the opportunity to participate in Spring Dual Enrollment coursework. If selected as part of the Dual Enrollment program, the tuition and fees are waived. However, the student is still responsible for a \$10.00 transcript fee, a parking pass of \$25.00 if parking on campus, a \$30.00 fee for a student ID, and the cost of textbooks, which varies by class. There will also be a mandatory orientation for all new students to attend prior to

the start of the semester. For a student to qualify for consideration for Dual Enrollment Program they must have at least a 3.0, a strong B average. For additional information or for an application, students should see Mrs. Abaray in the Guidance Office.
