Our Homecoming Weekend is on Friday, Oct. 13th and Saturday, Oct. 14th and will include activities for families this year. We invite you to kick-off the weekend with our Oct. 13th Friday-night Cougar football game held under the lights. We will be recognizing our SkillsUSA State Gold Medalists during our half-time celebration. Saturday, October 14th will begin with an OC tour at 8:30 a.m. and will continue throughout the day with a multitude of activities such as a children's concert, a middle-school pumpkin carving contest, a cornhole tournament fundraiser, live music, and the evening will end with our annual student Homecoming Dance.

The state will release the **2017 MCAS/PARCC Assessment and Accountability Results**, which will be available online for review. If you go to the school's website www.oldcolony.us, click the **About link**

and the **District Profile link**, you will be able to view Old Colony's aggregate data. The information will be posted by the middle of the month, and MCAS student reports will be mailed to parents by mid-October.

Freshmen have experienced two shop-exploratory sessions in September. Students will explore six more shops before reselecting and being placed in their permanent shop. Detailed information about the exploratory and placement process was shared with the freshmen at an assembly on Sept. 7th. Please remind your child to check their schedule and the expectations packet, carefully, and to come prepared and ready to work in each exploratory. For safety reasons, many shops have shoe and clothing requirements. Students must be dressed appropriately to participate in shop activities. All Old Colony students will be participating in the ALICE School Safety Practice Drill classroom training on Thursday, Oct. 5th, and a full practice lockdown/evacuation drill on Wed., Oct. 18th, which will be led by the Rochester Police Department, two Old Colony certified trainers, and the Southcoast SWAT team. The ALICE training offers school districts options that mitigate liability, assume less risk and, most importantly, equip students and faculty with life-saving skills.

Mare Studios has taken individual student pictures for the 2017-18 school year and lanyards with photo IDs have been issued to students at OC. All students are expected to wear them in and around the building daily. They are allowed to take them off while they are working in shop, if there is a safety hazard. Students who lose their ID and lanyard will be charged \$5 for a replacement. If a student forgets to wear their ID, or loses it, they will report to the front office and will be issued a temporary one to wear for the day. After three offenses, a detention will be issued to serve after school on a Tuesday or Thursday. The wearing of lanyards with student IDs is mandatory beginning on Monday, October 2, 2017.

All students have received or been notified of the **2017-18 Student Handbook** and sign-off forms, as well as the **Voluntary Student Accident Insurance Forms**. Both are posted online at www.oldcolony.us, under the **Parents' link**. It is important to return the insurance forms **whether students are taking the insurance or not**. Please sign <u>all</u> of the forms and have your child **return them school**.

On Thursday, Oct. 12th, the school adjustment and guidance counselors will be holding our annual Signs of Suicide (SOS) prevention program for the entire 9th grade. This is a process that we take very seriously, and it has allowed us to provide interventions to high-risk students. Parent letters will be sent home with more details about the program. A SAT Prep Workshop for senior students will be held on Monday, October 23, from 6:00-7:45 p.m., at the Acushnet Library, 232 Middle Road, Acushnet, MA. Advanced registrations will be taken at the library or by phone (508) 998-0270 and is limited to 25 students. The class is free and not limited to Acushnet residents and offered by Mrs. Nancy Francis, retired Old Colony math instructor.

The Preliminary SAT (PSAT) test has been scheduled through the Guidance Dept. during the school day at Old Colony RVTHS on Wednesday, October 11, 2017. The PSAT is a test designed to help students practice for the SAT. It is also used to determine eligibility for scholarships awarded by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation. All sophomore or junior students are eligible to take this test. The cost of the test is \$16.00. Fee waivers are available to juniors (Class of 2019) who inform their Guidance Counselor that they receive free/reduced lunch. Any student who is interested in taking the test should sign up in the OC Guidance Office. Please make the check or money order out to Old Colony RVTHS. Please put your child's full name on the *Memo* line of the check. Cash will also be accepted. PSAT's and SAT's are NOT required for students who are interested in pursuing a degree at Bristol Community College or any other community college.
