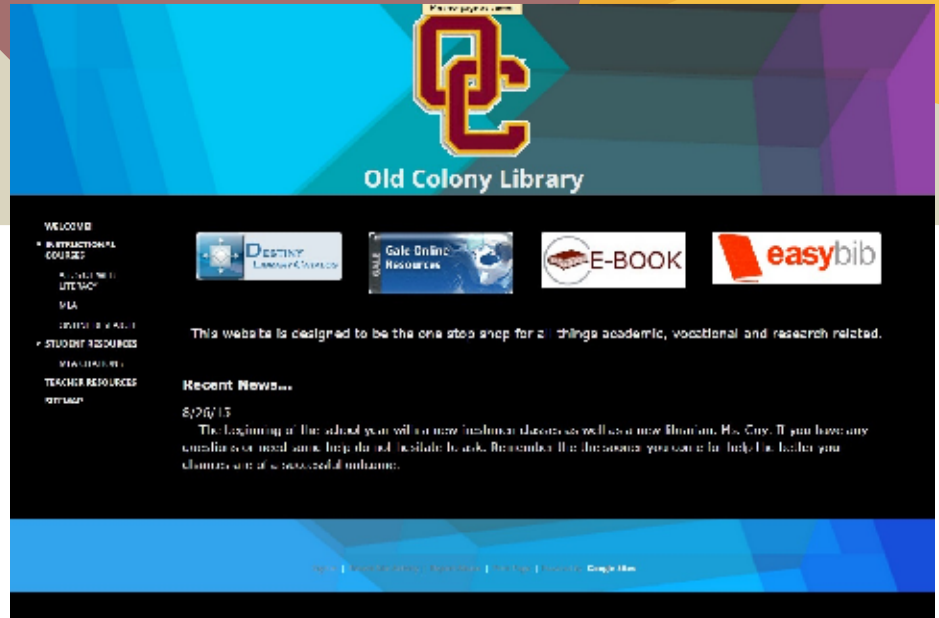


JOIN THE BOOK CLUB!
