


A credit to her profession, Miss Ashley gave much of herself to her students, coping with many difficulties to continue teaching and giving.


Miss Ashley will be greatly missed as an educator, co-worker, and friend.

The 1977-1978 Basketball Season got off to a slow start but after a few games the guys started playing real good and worked great together as a team.


The team showed determination and enthusiasm as they took on other teams in non-league competition.
