




MR. ROBERT FAY

Desert Storm Commander General H. Norman Schwarzkopf gave a thumbs up to the crowd as he made his way up Broadway during New York's Operation Welcome Home parade in June 1991. Over 600,000 people attended the parade to welcome home the troops. The celebration was capped off by a fireworks extravaganza.


During the seven-month Iraqi occupation of Kuwait, more than 730 oil wells were damaged or set ablaze. Firefighting crews have been able to extinguish 584 wells since the effort began in March 1991.

On July 11, 1991, the moon slipped over the sun in the celestial ceremony of the eclipse, turning day into night for thousands of viewers and scientists. One

of the objectives for the scientists was to learn more about the sun's corona.

1992's film of the year, "Silence of the Lambs," stirred horror in the hearts of many that viewed it. Behind the scenes of Hollywood, there actually exists a man who is a real serial killer. The most terrifying thought is that he was known as a "normal" person, a man who worked in a Chocolate Factory and led a quiet life. Milwaukee's 31-year old Jeffrey Dauhmer's secret was revealed as he has confessed to seventeen grotesque murders. Other dark aspects of his life include his troubling history of alcoholism, and sex offenses. Through research conducted by the FBI's behavior science unit, we hope to find a pattern which will help us in the future to prevent these senseless, violent crimes.


When a tape of Rodney King, a black man being senselessly beaten by Los Angeles police officers was originally released, a considerable amount of controversy developed. A year later, the tension exploded after the four white police officers who had attacked him were acquitted, even though the tape was used as powerful evidence. The verdict sparked violence that revealed racial divisions that had plagued the city for years. The violence included looting, burning, beatings, and killings. For more than 48 hours, an urban nightmare came true, as hatred ruled the streets. During that time, parts of the city virtually ceased to function. The 7,800 members of the police department were assisted by 2,000 National Guard Troops and 4,500 federal troops. Rebuilding the city, and healing the hurts of the people was a long, intense






















The brush fire that killed 19 people in Oakland, CA, was the costliest blaze in US history — the damage was put at more than \$5 billion.

Pushed by 25 mph winds across brush that had been dried by five years of drought, the October 1991 blaze destroyed more than 1,800 houses and 900 apartments.

At least 19 people were killed, 148 injured, and 5,000 evacuated.

President Bush declared the fire site a major disaster area, opening the door to federal aid for the rebuilding.

For the first time in US History, five presidents gathered together to open the doors of President Reagan's presidential library on November 5, 1991. The Spanish style structure is nestled on 100 acres about 50 miles from Los Angeles. "The doors of this library are open now and all are welcome," Reagan said. "The judgement of history is left to you, the people."

Over 500,000 marchers comerged on Washington to participate in the largest demonstration in the Capital's history. The next day, the administration still renewed its call to overturn Roe vs. Wade, the 1973 case that established the constitutional right to abortion.

A wild night of partying and bar hopping ended in an ugly charge of rape for one of America's most famous families. William Kennedy Smith was accused and put on trial for charges of rape. 27-year old Michele Cassone, a waitress at Testa's Restaurant, accused Smith of raping her on the beach after he had gone swimming. The jury found Mr. Smith not guilty.

During Clarence Thomas' confirmation hearing Anita Hill went public with her accusations of sexual harassment against Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas. Before the days of exhausting testimony would end, Hill would cooly and impassively detail the nature of Thomas' alleged harassment while she worked for him in government positions. "What happened and telling the world about it are the two most difficult experiences of my life." She says she does not regret coming forward — even though Thomas was confirmed. She offered one piece of advice to victims of sexual harassment. "Try to find someone you can trust and tell them," she said, "Try to find somebody who can make you feel you are not at fault. Find someone you can trust because you can't take it all out on yourself, you can't internalize it."



Soviet President Mikhail S. Gorbachev and his family were placed under house arrest in the Crimea on August 19, 1991 as an eighty man emergency committee led by Vice President Gennady Yanayev took power in a coup attempt in the Soviet Union.

Boris Yeltsin called on Russians to resist the takover. Constructing a protective human wall around Yeltsin's headquarters, his supporters demanded Gorbachev's return.

When the Communist party denounced the takeover, Yanayev and the other coup leaders fled Moscow. Latvia and Estonia declared immediate independence from the Soviet Union.

The coup had failed, and before the day was through, all coup leaders were arrested, except for Interior Minister Boris Pugo, who reportedly killed himself.

Freedom has come to the Soviet Union.

On September 14, 1991, Carolyn Suzanne Sapp from Honolulu, Hawaii shed tears of joy as she was crowned Miss America. Within days, however, her experience of physical abuse from her boyfriend became public knowledge. Carolyn Sapp has put the trauma behind her and gone forward with strength and courage to win the Miss America crown. She has selected the issue of parental responsibility as the social issue she will focus on during her reign.


After 2,455 days, Hostage Terry Anderson won his freedom at last. He was taken by Islamic Jihad four days after the US vetoed a UN resolution that condemned Israeli action in Southern Lebanon in 1985. His spirits were incredibly high for someone who had been tortured for almost 6 and a half years.


Highlighting this years Winter Olympics from Albertville, France were the figure skating events. American skater Kristi Yamaguchi won the hearts of people around the world as she skated a gold medal performance in woman's figure skating. American Nancy Kerrigan captured the bronze medal in the same event. In other Olympic news, speed skater Bonnie Blair won the first medal of the Olympics for the Americans, and was the only American to win two gold medals. A total of 11 medals were earned by the USA.


The Minnesota Twins squeezed past the Atlanta Braves 1-0 on pinch hitter Gene Larkin's single in the bottom of the 10th inning on October 27, 1991 to win Game 7 and end baseball's most dramatic odyssey. Twins coach, Tom Kelly said "Someone had to go home a loser, but there's no loser in my mind. Those are two of the greatest teams. I just didn't want to quit. Somehow, we found a way to win this thing,"

Mark Rypien was named MVP of the Redskins 37-24 Super Bowl victory over Buffalo on January 26, 1992. Most of Superbowl Sunday was spent in anticipation of the biggest game Rypien would ever play. He competed 18 of 33 passes for 292 yards and two touchdowns.

World Champion boxer Mike Tyson is now a convicted rapist. Desiree Washington, an eighteen year old beauty queen came forward with her story of Tyson's brutal attack. He lured her into his room in the Canterbury Hotel in Indianapolis. Tyson will serve six years in prison and will pay \$30,000 in fines.


Superstar Magic Johnson shocked the world with his announcement to retire. His reason, he has tested positive for the deadly HIV virus which causes AIDS. Johnson, a well-known basketball player for the Los Angeles Lakers holds several honors. He was named the NBA most valuable player for 1987, 1989, and 1990. 















To the Class of 1992

















FOOTBALL
