Are you saving money for your child's education? **MA Dept. of Ed Resource Corner** recently **published: "Help Families Save Money for Both K-12 and College Expenses."** The Department has compiled a wide array of ways in which parents can [save money for their child's education](#). This link gives **information for parents** and encourages ways to **look into savings options**. Of particular note, parents of **students with significant disabilities** can now set up **special tax-free accounts** to use on a **wide range of services** throughout a child's life. The site also lists a **variety of college-savings options**, including **tax-free accounts, early tuition options, local savings accounts**, and more.

School nurse, Michelle Humphrey, would like to inform our OC families that **the influenza activity is increasing in Massachusetts** and to remind everyone that **the Flu vaccine** offers the **best protection** against the potentially serious disease. Here in New England **most flu seasons do not peak until February or even mid-March**, so there is still **plenty of time to get a flu shot**, if you haven't already. As we embark on our **winter months**, I want to give you **some inclement weather information**. Our **primary concern** when winter weather strikes is **our students** and their ability to **safely travel** between home and school. OC serves students **from 6 towns**, and as an independent district, OC renders cancellation decisions that **apply to all Old Colony students**, regardless of their town of residence. We must **consult with local officials** and consider the **latest conditions** from **all sending districts**. **Key factors in determining a potential closure or delayed start including road conditions, timing of the storm, and how much snow is expected**. The condition of **school parking lots** and **whether or not the school has power** are also important factors.

We make every effort to notify students and faculty of a **cancellation by 6 a.m. through Facebook, Twitter, local TV and radio stations**, which will broadcast announcements when school is closed or a one or two-hour delay in opening. **When there is a delay, buses will run one or two hours later than their normal scheduled pick-up times**.

Old Colony also **provides an automated phone and email message** to every faculty and student's household **for school closings, delayed starts, or unexpected releases**. Closings will be listed on the **Old Colony website**, as well.

We **may release students early if conditions will decline** before 2:16 p.m. If there is an unexpected release, the school will **notify parents via social media sites, automated message, email, and local TV/radio stations, as well as posted on the school's website**. Students who normally take the bus to and from school will be able to do so.

A **junior or senior student should not be attending co-op** on days **when school is cancelled**. The student must **notify their supervisor** when **school is closed**, has a **one or two-hour delayed start**, or **is releasing early** due to weather conditions. **Cancelling all-school activities** includes co-operative employment as it is directly related to **Old Colony RVTHS safety procedures**.
