Dear Old Colony Community,

We hope this message finds you and your families healthy & safe. The 2019-2020 school year has been an interesting journey, to say the least. There have been mornings where I'm sure we've opened our eyes with hopes that all that we are experiencing in 2020 is part of a dream, and then paused on our way to coffee and the next Zoom meeting. As we are faced with the challenges before us, we've found strength by coming together. We must walk in the shoes of one another and lift each other up to find our place in a world that demands agility, more than ever before.

There was a time when Blockbuster Video dominated the market, and at the time, a small company called Netflix created a mail-in DVD service. There were people who laughed, and thought, "Who wants to wait two days when they can drive to the store and get what they need within minutes?" Remote Learning Plan Update for June 15th-19th

This assignment can be found in their History teacher's Google Classroom on Monday morning. It must be completed using Google Docs, and shared with ALL of their academic AND shop teachers by Wednesday June 17th at 8pm.

Help with P-EBT Cards

Families whose students qualify for free or reduced-price lunch started to receive P-EBT cards in the mail on Friday, May 29, and many are having trouble activating their card. To activate (or PIN) a P-EBT card, families will need the letter that the Department of Transitional Assistance (DTA) sent them, which contains their child's case number. If families lost the letter or never received one, they can go to DTAConnect.com/pebt to get their child's case number. The tool at that link will pre-populate with the standard first 10 digits of the P-EBT card. Please note that the tool is not available on the DTA Connect mobile app.

Families that have their child's case number can use the following instructions: (The Massachusetts EBT vendor was not able to change the automated prompts callers hear when they call to PIN any EBT card [SNAP, TAFDC, or P-EBT], and unfortunately, some of the automated instructions should be different for P-EBT cards.)

- Call the EBT card phone number on the back of the P-EBT card: 800-997-2555.
- Enter the P-EBT card number (it is an 18-digit number).

- Callers will then be prompted to enter the last four digits of their Social Security number. Do not enter the last 4 digits of a Social Security number. For the P-EBT cards, callers must enter the last four digits of their child's case number that was provided on the DTA letter they received in the mail.
- Then enter the child's date of birth using a two-digit month, two-digit day, and four-digit year (example: 04/06/2005).
