#### **School Nutrition Update**

Thank you to Crystal Andrade, our School Nutrition Director and her incredible team who have put in countless hours beyond the typical workday to address food security for our Old Colony Community. As we continue in our effort to minimize spread and maximize safety, we ask families to remember the importance of staying home if students and/or staff present symptoms, are close contacts, or have tested positive for Covid-19. The importance of timely reporting to our nursing staff in the event a member of your family receives a positive test, as well as appropriate PPE use, mask wearing, and social distancing in our school setting remain high priorities. Below is the list of symptoms for which all parents/caregivers should monitor their children daily, prior to school attendance. Staff should monitor themselves:

- Fever (100.0° Fahrenheit or higher) or chills
- Cough (not due to other known cause)
- Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Headache when in combination with other symptoms
- Muscle aches or body aches
- Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea
- Fatigue, when in combination with other symptoms
- Nasal congestion or runny nose (not due to other known causes, such as allergies) when in combination with other symptoms

Our last day of school is Wednesday, June 16<sup>th</sup> with Senior Sign-Out scheduled for May 28<sup>th</sup>. Graduation ceremonies are scheduled for Sunday, June 6<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 a.m. Graduation attendance will be limited to graduates, 4 members of their family (or guests), and Old Colony staff. Separate correspondence will be sent to families of the Class of 2021 with an overview specific to Senior Week events and details regarding graduation.

A tremendous amount of planning and work has taken place over the past year and especially in recent weeks. I would like to extend my appreciation to our entire community for the collaborative efforts of the group. The past year has been challenging, but certainly not lost. We are excited to reconvene as an entire community and wish you health, happiness, and peace of mind as we slowly return to a semblance of normalcy.
