

# Honor requires sacrifice

We extend our thanks and honor to those associated with Old Colony who serve our country in the military. The Old Colony family extends their gratitude to Colonel Nancy Souza, who is one of the physical education and health instructors at our school.

With honor comes the sacrifice of time spent away from the family. **Mrs. Tracy Knowles**, a Sergeant in the National Guard's Army Division 101st Battalion of Engineers, shared her experience of life in a military family with the CIT students on May 29, 2009. Mrs. Knowles is the mother of a **Shana Rocca**, a Computer Information Technology student. During her first tour to Iraq, Shana was only able to communicate with her mother once during the year. Mrs. Knowles left for her second tour of duty to Iraq on June 13, 2009. Shana is hopeful that they will be able to communicate more often this time.

Former Old Colony graduate **Tyler Trahan** made the ultimate sacrifice in giving his life for his country in Al Anbar Province, Iraq, on April 30, 2009. Tyler was a 2004 graduate of the House & Mill Carpentry shop and quarterback of the football team. On the day of his funeral, the Old Colony family paid their tribute. Students from the National Honor Society, football team, and carpentry shop lined the road leading to the school. American flags were flown along the road, as well. As the funeral cortege passed by, taking the body of Petty Officer 2nd Class Tyler John Trahan to his resting place in the Massachusetts National Cemetery at Otis Air Force Base in Bourne, MA, students and faculty stood in silence and saluted the fallen hero.
