Can Video Games Make You Smarter?

We have all been told at one point or another as a child or even as an adult that videogames are a waste of time, and that they destroy our brain. However, research says that playing video games can have some benefits specifically, make you smarter. Is this true?

Gamers who were tested by researchers said that they have noticed "improving attention skills, brain processing, and cognitive functions including low-level vision through highlevel cognitive abilities." The re-

searchers also found that "brain training" games have less of an effect than game genres such as first person shooters, strategy, or puzzle games. Earlier this year, an institute known as the Max-Planck Institute of Human Development scanned the brains of three gamers and found that their brain was developing in three separate areas: the prefrontal cortex, right hippocampus, and cerebellum. (These parts of the brain are involved with complex cognitive tasks, navigation, fine motor control, and spatial memory.) Another study conducted by the University of Geneva

determined that gamers who play firstperson shooters and action games were seemingly better at moving their at-

tention away from the screen while staying vigilant to the environment around them. In other words, gamers tend to be better at visual learning than non-gamers.

History Vs. Current Events

On November 4th, 2008, the first black president in United States history was voted into office. Democratic Senator Barack Obama of Illinois beat Republican Senator John McCain in the 2008 presidential election. The 47 -year old candidate achieved 365 electoral votes, or nearly 53% of the popular vote; his 72 year old opponent, earned 173 electoral votes, or more than 45% of the popular vote.

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With two new drugs known as rapamycin and metformin, we are developing an all new way to prolong the inevitable. Rapamycin is a fairly new drug used to treat organ transplant patients because it helps the organ to not get rejected by the body. Now, scientists are learning new ways for rapamycin to be used. They have now discovered that rapamycin can help animals live longer after testing it on mice and receiving positive results. Researchers are optimistic about the drug because it was found to have a 9-14% chance of a increasing the lifespans of the mice.

Unfortunately, the drug had been found to increase the risk of diabetes when taken in large doses. To counter the risk of diabetes, scientists are developing another drug called metformin in order to treat diabetes. Metformin is the only other drug that has caused so much excitement in the anti-aging industry. It has only had a small effect on the mice experiment, but has already shown much promise when tested on humans. According to a 2014 study of 7,800 diabetics, those who used metformin lived longer than those who did not. The diabetics who used the drug even lived slightly longer than non-diabetics.

In conclusion, rapamycin has increased the effects of anti-aging, but with a severe side effect, and will be further studied before becoming a actual product. On the other hand, metformin has already shown promise for helping diabetics lengthen their lifespan.
